As we ring in the New Year, it is always nice to reflect back on the previous year – and what a vear it was!

Shortly after sending out our inaugural issue of "The State of Golf", we learned of Rod Perry earning his second consecutive PGA Player of Year! What a tremendous accomplishment; we are all proud of Rod's success.

In the Spring, Mississippi State hosted Sam Houston State in our annual Heritage Cup matches. The teams enjoyed great camaraderie and competition during the 54-hole match play event played at the MSU Golf Course. Mississippi State won its 5th consecutive Cup with a match record, 17-5 victory.

During the summer, we hosted, in conjunction with the PGA of America, the PGA Golf Management Summer experience. Six students from around the country spent a week on the Mississippi State campus attending meetings, classes, touring campus, visiting with alumni/students, and playing golf. In short, getting a feel for being a PGA Golf Management student at Mississippi State. several attendees to enroll in the PGA Golf Management program.

The Fall 2014 semester will go down in the record books at Mississippi State! The football team created a buzz not only on campus, but around the country. As I traveled around the country through the fall, I was constantly asked about the excitement on campus. It was truly an amazing time!

As promised, we hosted an Alumni Weekend you didn't want to miss. It was so big, even ESPN's College Game Day made their first trip to Starkville!! The Alumni event was hosted in conjunction with the MSU Women's and Men's Golf Teams and was sponsored by Ben Nelson Golf Cars. We had over 70 attendees from all of the programs! Unfortunately, the students once again defeated the alumni in our four-ball match play event played at the MSU Golf Course. A few weeks later, we hosted nearly 200 family members and friends for our annual Family Weekend. A great time was had by all as Mississippi State continued their winning ways on the football field. 

Alumni Spytlight: Steve Atherton Interviewed by: Daniel Soehren, PGA

Name: Steve Atherton, PGA Master Professional Hometown: Mendota, IL Years @ MSU: 1995-1999 Current Position: Teaching Professional, Eagle Springs Golf Club - Wolcott, CO

Q. When you think of your time at MSU, what comes to mind?

A. When I look back on my time at MSU I think of venturing out on my own, away from my home and family in Illinois. I didn't realize it at the time but MSU was the vehicle that helped me become an independent young adult alongside the life-long friends that I made both at MSU and on the amazing internships that shaped my career in golf. I also think about the incredible college experience at MSU - Bulldogs football, baseball and basketball games, playing golf at the yard and club volleyball, the great

food in Starkvegas, and spending time at the amazing Sanderson Center after the first few years in the Tin Gym. MSU is a very special place - one that I will always have fond memories of.

Q. What is the best piece of advice you have for current MSU PGM students?

A. Seek to find your own truths. When something doesn't make sense ask "why?" and start looking for answers in places others haven't looked before. Most of the best lessons I've learned in my life came from a natural skepticism which made me question commonly held beliefs and search for my own answers. That line of thinking helped me learn more about teaching golf than any instruction book I've ever read.



Q. Who or what was your inspiration to pursue a career in golf?

A. Golf was my inspiration. I love the game, and when I found out that there was a major called Professional Golf Management that would allow me to go to school while working toward a career as a golf professional I was all in.

Q. How/when did you decide to pursue instruction?

A. The internships I did at WestLake CC, Olympia Fields CC and Merion GC along with my first Assistant Pro job at Sankaty Head GC helped me acquire many valuable skills and build a solid resume for a career as a head professional. However, those experiences also helped me realize that a life as a head professional might not be the right direction for me. My parents were both teachers, and I feel like teaching and helping others is in my blood, so after my first season at Sankaty Head I decided to join the crew at GolfTEC in Denver, CO and become a full-time teaching professional. It's been a great decision for my career and my lifestyle.

Q. Where do see yourself in 5 years? 10 years?

A. In five years my main career goal is to have made GOLF Magazine and Golf Digest's lists of the best teachers and to have taught players on the PGA and/or LPGA Tours. Ten years down the road is more difficult for me to see. I like to see what opportunities arise which keeps me on my toes and allows me to continue to grow and adapt in my career.

Q. Who would be your dream foursome and where would you play?

A. I love to laugh and have a good time, so my dream foursome would be Stephen Colbert, Shaq, and Arnold Palmer. Cypress Point is at the top of my list of courses I haven't played yet, so that's where we'd play.


Q. Please list your awards and professional accomplishments.

Why did you choose MSU (and PGA Golf Management)?

A: When I first visited Mississippi State, there was a great sense of comfort and it really felt like home to me. I chose the PGA Golf Management because golf was my passion and it provided me a chance to pursue a career in golf.

Tell us about your experiences on internship.

Arnie has influenced the PGA Tour in a lot of ways and helpedit become what we know it as today. Campbell Wins 13th Annual PGA Jones Cup

PORT ST. LUCIE, Fla. – Campbell University of Buies Creek, North Carolina, came to the 13th PGA Jones Cup presented by Golf Advisor at PGA Golf Club on a mission – to become the first team to capture four titles.

The Camels led wire-to-wire in the 36-hole event, which features players from the 19 colleges and universities accredited by the PGA of America for aspiring PGA Professionals. Campbell built off of its fourstroke lead entering the final round, to win by 11 strokes over runner-up Florida State University.

Campbell and Mississippi State were both vying for a record fourth title, but Campbell prevailed, capitalizing on a game plan to play steady, controlled golf to set the mark.

"When you come to Campbell, we expect you to be a good player – it's part of the Campbell pride and PGA pride," said Ken Jones, Director of Campbell's PGA Golf Management University Program. "We came down with a team that was set up to do this.

We thought it was great that we were paired together with Mississippi State and Coastal


Carolina [in addition to FSU], as we had won eight PGA Jones Cups between the three of us going in. It feels really good to win."

The PGA Jones Cup presented by Golf Advisor is named for the first PGA Golf Management University Program Director at Mississippi State, Dr. S. Roland Jones, who held the position from 1985 until his passing in 1997. The event provides a platform where participants can display professionalism, integrity, character and camaraderie; all characteristics Dr. Jones instilled in PGA Golf Management students.

Bulldogs Win 5th Straight Heritage Cup


STARKVILLE, MS – Hosting its 4th Heritage Cup, Mississippi State boasted one of its strongest teams in the history of the event. Led by graduating Seniors, Stephen Norris and David Lindsey, the Bulldogs completed the most convincing victory in Heritage Cup history, beating Sam Houston State by a margin of 12 points, 17-5.

MSU was able to secure the first two points in the event and never looked back. The duo of David Lindsey and Andrew Porubiansky, who both claim Carrolton, GA as their hometown, recorded the first point with a win in Four Ball, and were undefeated on the weekend. They accounted for 3.5 (of 4 possible) of MSU's 17 total points.

Though leading 8.5 – 3.5 heading into the

Singles matches, the final outcome for MSU was murky until late on the back nine. Of the ten Singles matches, eight reached the 17th hole undecided. Several matches changed hands multiple times, but it was the Georgia boys that locked it up, as Lindsey won 3 of the last 4 holes to halve his match, and Porubiansky won 5&4 to bring MSU's total to 12 (11.5 needed to win the Cup).

This was State's 6th Heritage Cup victory, and have won the last 5 events. The matches were played much closer than the score-line reflected, and a tough 2015 Heritage Cup is expected in Hunstville, TX next spring.

Player Development Program Takes Hold

The ability to play and teach the game of golf are absolutely essential to success as a PGA Golf Professional. A few years ago, the PGA Golf Management staff asked ourselves one simple question, "Are we doing as much as possible to help students get better at the game both before and after the PAT?". The staff has always worked very closely with the students while offering a number of tournament opportunities, but we felt we could do more.

So in the summer of 2013, we tested a new Player Development Program in an effort to help current students pass the PGA of America's Playing Ability Test (PAT) and challenge the program's better players to continue to work on their game. Through our observation, we determined all of the students possessed a certain level of ability to swing the golf club, but lack the understanding of how to practice and play the game. The question arose, how do we get the students to play and practice the correct way?

Starting in the Fall of 2013, the new Player Development Program was unveiled and all of the students in the program who had not passed the PAT were required to participate along with and other students who wanted to improve. The program was simple but effective; each student completed four assigned drills per week that addressed putting, short game, full swing, and an on-course component. Each drill was designed to challenge the student and to keep score. Students were required to submit their drill scores and they were posted in the PGA Golf Management Office. That way, each student in the program could see how he/she stacked up against the other students in the program. "This really taught me how to practice effectively," said Senior Braxton Rainey, "I now focus each time I practice to achieve a score rather than hit balls with no goal."

The competitive nature of each student began to arise as they began to compete during practice!



Since that semester, the PAT passing rate per event has continued to rise. Currently, 80% of the students have passed the PAT while the average number of attempts to pass is 2. We have continued to modify the program with new drills, but the premise remains the same: the more you can get your students to practice deliberately and focus on achieving a goal, the faster he/she will improve.

Each Friday afternoon at the MSU Golf Course, we spend time on the short game areas and practice tee, providing individual instruction to students who seek our help. High-speed video and our Trackman unit have made a great difference in helping students understand cause and effect in the golf swing and ball flight.

Finally, each student is required to achieve a score of 83 or below in at least one of the semester tournament rounds. Since this policy was enacted, the PGA Golf Management tournaments have almost doubled in participation while overall scoring averages have dropped below 80. With over 90 students on campus and 650 tournament rounds played, this past fall's overall scoring average for the entire program was 79.5.

This is an immense accomplishment for the program and we expect that number to continue to improve as the students get better and better at the game. We are proud of the efforts put forth by the students and they will be better PGA Professionals due to their playing ability.

Perry takes Back-to-Back PGA Professional Player Award

PALM BEACH GARDENS, Fla. – Reigning National Champion Rod Perry of Port Orange, Fla., put the finishing touches on a memorable 2013 season Friday evening by capturing his second consecutive PGA Professional Player of the Year award.

Perry, 40, the PGA head professional at Crane Lakes Golf and Country Club in Port Orange, secured the honor by finishing tied for third in the final PGA Tournament Series event of the season at PGA Golf Club in Port St. Lucie, Fla. Perry is the lone left-handed player and sole PGA Golf Management University graduate to win a PGA Professional National Championship and a PGA Professional Player of the Year Award.

Perry won his first National Championship in

in Sunriver, Ore., and then added a seventh North Florida PGA Section Championship and seventh Section Player of the Year title. Over the past two months in the six-event PGA Tournament Series, he collected four top-10 finishes and placed fourth on the money list.

Perry earned 1,191.5 overall points to edge former National Champion Bob Sowards of Dublin, Ohio, a three-time PGA Professional Player of the Year who had 1,107.5 points. Jeff Sorenson of Blaine, Minn., was next at 771.25, followed by David Muttitt of Albuquerque, N.M., with 771, and Kelly Mitchum of Southern Pines, N.C., with 757.5.

Perry is the second North Florida PGA member (following Brett Upper of Clearwater, Fla., in 1990) to garner a PGA Professional Player of the Year, an award which began in 1984. Perry will be honored June 20, 2014, in Myrtle Beach, S.C., at the 47th PGA Professional National Championship presented by Club Car, Mercedes-Benz USA and OMEGA. The 2013 Senior PGA Professional Player of the Year also will be honored at that time, but the recipient will be determined April 18, 2014, following the conclusion of the postponed Southworth Senior PGA Professional National Champion- ship.



Perry said the comfort of a support staff during his absence from Crane Lakes Golf and Country Club enabled him to concentrate on the PGA Tournament Series as well as other national events throughout the season.

"Last year, it was all new to me being in position to win this award," said Perry. "This year, I was a little more knowledgeable about the system. When Bob Sowards came out of the gate this year and won the PGA Stroke and Match Play titles, I knew that it was going to be difficult to repeat. Thankfully, after winning my Section Championship, I had momentum. Bob Sowards is an excellent player, and it is never easy to keep him at bay in any event.

"It is a great situation to be in to have the support of your club's owners - the Becks Corporation - and that of Director of Business Development Craig Wells along with our members and staff. Their support allowed me the chance to go out and contend for this award. The members take a very wholehearted interest in not only my playing but my whole life."

The final Player of the Year standings were determined based on a point system involving national and PGA Section competitions from Jan. 1 through Dec. 20, 2013.

Perry garnered 500 points for winning the PGA Professional National Championship, 300 for

the North Florida PGA Section Player of the Year, 100 additional points for winning the Section Championship; 149 for making the cut in the Arnold Palmer Invitational and 50 more for competing in the Tampa Bay Championship. He rounded out his season by earning 70 points for finishing fourth on the PGA Tournament Series money list and 22.5 for making the cut in the PGA Stroke Play Championship.

"Finishing runner-up for three straight years is not the way you want to end up, but give Rod the credit for a fantastic year," said Sowards, the 2004 PGA Professional National Champion and the 2003-05 PGA Professional Player of the Year. "He's a great guy and we have played a lot together, and were each members of the PGA Cup Team this year. It's always my goal to win this award."

MSU Falls to GA TECH in ORANGE BOWL

STARKVILLE, Miss. – After compiling the best regular season in Mississippi State football history, the seventh-ranked Bulldogs fell to No. 12 Georgia Tech, 49-34 in the 2014 Capital One Orange Bowl on Wednesday, Dec. 31 at Sun Life Stadium in Sun Gardens, Fla.

MSU (10-3, 6-2 SEC) is made its school-record fifth straight bowl appearance and 18th overall appearance dating back to 1937. The Bulldogs played in their third Orange Bowl and first since Jan. 1, 1941. That year, MSU topped Georgetown, 14-7. MSU's first-ever bowl appearance was also in the Orange Bowl against Duquesne in 1937.

Led by National Player of the Year candidate quarterback Dak Prescott, the Bulldogs amassed 10 regular season wins for the first time in program history and will head to Miami with its highest ranking ever to enter a bowl game. Its previous high was No. 9 when entering the 1941 Orange Bowl. the nation's top rushing offenses. Quarterback Justin Thomas lead a spread option attack that ranked third in the nation in rushing yards (333.6 ypg). Thomas ranked fourth nationally amongst quarterbacks with 965 rushing yards, just ahead of Prescott's 939.

The two teams will faced off for the fifth time and first since 2009 in Mullen's first season. The then 25th-ranked Yellow Jackets claimed a 42-31 win in Starkville on Oct. 3, 2009. Georgia Tech leads the all-time series 5-0.

This was not the Bulldogs of two years ago, which following a 7-0 start, were derailed entirely. This season was different. Although losing tow tough games down the stretch, MSU set a new standard for football expectations in Starkville, having reached No. 1 for the first time in school history.

Standout players running back Josh Robinson and linebacker Bernardrick McKinney have declared intentions to enter the 2015 NFL Draft. In total, 15 players from this past season will be graduating, leaving some significant holes to fill for MSU's currently 11th-ranked 2015 recruiting class, according ESPN.

Mississippi State will look to lean on its core of quarterback, Dak Prescott and wide receiver De'Runnya Wilson in 2015.

Georgia Tech (11-3, 6-2 ACC) boasted one of



Mississippi State Athletics Unveils Dudy Noble Field Master Plan

STARKVILLE, Miss. – Mississippi State Athletics unveiled the Dudy Noble Field Master Plan on Tuesday, an ambitious \$40 million facility project that aims to remake the Bulldogs' home ballpark into the finest in college baseball.

The Dudy Noble Field Master Plan calls for a new double-tiered grandstand with chairback seating, an elevated concourse that encircles the playing field and allows a constant view of the game action, welcoming entry plazas, spacious restrooms, concessions, a kids' play area, berm seating, upgraded field lighting, HD video board, digital ribbon signage, team areas (clubhouse, training room, equipment room, coaches' offices, etc.) and dramatically improved aesthetics.

"Mississippi State Baseball first set the standard for making college baseball games a happening, becoming one of the first schools to invest in a modern facility nearly 30 years ago," said MSU Director of Athletics Scott Stricklin. "The new Dudy Noble Field Master Plan will provide our players, coaches and fans the best ballpark in all of college baseball." "This is a monumental day for our baseball program, and something every Bulldog player and fan deserves," said MSU head baseball coach John Cohen. "As a former player and now coach, I know the greatest fans in college baseball will take action to ensure our players and coaching staff have the necessary amenities and resources to recruit and compete at the highest level."

Capacity is planned to allow MSU to continue to host the largest crowds in college baseball. The new grandstand will hold more fans than the current grandstand, berm seating down each line will allow for greater general admission seating and the outfield should accommodate the same number of fans, if not more. Additionally, there will be excellent standing room views of the field surrounding the concourse that the current facility does not provide.

Mississippi State currently owns the top 10 oncampus crowds in NCAA baseball history. On April 12, 2014, Bulldog fans shattered the single-game NCAA on-campus attendance record as 15,586 fans witnessed a 6-5 MSU victory against in-state rival Ole Miss.
