#### A Letter from the Dean...

This has been another great year for the College of Business. The College enrollment grew by 24 percent this past fall, compared to 4 percent for the university, and more than any other college on campus. Total enrollment for the College of Business is over 2700, the highest in recent history.

Last spring, we officially opened the Center for Entrepreneurship and Outreach (CEO) in a newly remodeled space on the first floor of McCool. The center is "home base" for our 130 student-run businesses. The build out of the center was made possible through generous gifts from our donors and a grant from the Appalachian Regional Authority. Currently we are in the planning stages for a Phase 2 of the CEO-- a cutting edge business behavioral research lab to be housed on the second floor of McCool. In addition to providing space for students and faculty to conduct applied research, the lab will be available for intensive market testing and branding of products developed by our budding entrepreneurs.

Last year the Richard C. Adkerson School of Accountancy was ranked third in the nation for both undergraduate and graduate accounting programs (with 15 or fewer faculty) by the Commerce Clearing House *Public Accounting Report* and among the nation's best for

programs of any size. And, we just learned our Distance MBA program is ranked 18th, up from 25th last year, by US News & World Reports.

Our PGA Golf Management program continues to be one of the best in the country. And, as you know, the University Golf Course is now part of the College. Alumni tell me all the time that the Golf Course never looked so good—thanks to Mike Hammond and Pat Sneed.

In February, 2017, the College will undergo a re-accreditation visit by the AACSB. Always of interest to the peer review team is the PGA Golf Management Program which is always a bragging point for us.

At the university level, the Infinite Impact campaign is now a billion dollar campaign. If you would like to make a contribution to the capital campaign, please know that you would be making an impact on the PGA Golf Management program through a designated gift.

Finally it is with both sadness and pride that we say goodbye to Adam Scott. Adam has been such an integral part of the success of the PGM program and he will be sorely missed. But, speaking on behalf of the entire College, we are extremely proud to see him become the new director of the PGA Golf Management Program at UCCS. Adam has definitely put his mark on our program and we are better for it.

Next time you are in town, please stop by the Dean's office. I love to get to know our alums and find out where you are.

# **MSU Wins 7th Consecutive Heritage Cup**

STARKVILLE, MS - The final score does not reflect it, but the 2016 playing of the Heritage Cup between the PGA Golf Management Program of Mississippi State and Sam Houston State was a tightly contested event. The Bulldogs were able to secure their seventh consecutive victory in the annual matches, with a final tally of 14.5 - 7.5.

The host team rallied around Director, Jeff Adkerson, as he made known to the team shortly prior to the event, that this would be his final competitive event in his golfing career, shortened by injury. They responded early by jumping out to a 4.5 - 1.5 lead in the morning Foursomes matches. The host team is able to select which order the formats would be played, and team captains However, the Singles rally was halted by Jeff Adkerson and Adam Scott determined The first points on the board came from the fourth match out, as Robbie Fields and Eric Voss, the "2-5-6 Mafia", made their presence felt with a convincing 5 & 4 victory in both players' first match in Heritage Cup play.







# NMSU Goes Back-to-Back

By: John Dever, PGA of America PORT ST. LUCIE, Fla. - Some say that once is a mistake, and twice could be a pattern.

For New Mexico State University's PGA Golf Management program, which today secured its second Jones Cup in as many vears on the Wanamaker Course at PGA Golf Club, back-to-back victories suggest the strong likelihood of a winning program pedigree.

With a two-day total of 594, the Aggies became the first program to win consecutive Jones Cups since Coastal Carolina in 2004 and '05.

Penning a remarkably similar script to last year, New Mexico State erased a three-shot deficit after the first day to edge Florida Gulf Coast University (597). North Carolina State (600) and Eastern Kentucky pushed hard on Wednesday, but placed third and fourth, respectively.

Last year, the Aggies trailed by two shots before ultimately claiming their third Jones Cup in program history. NMSU's initial victory in the event came in 2006.

them that they can never take the 2015 Jones Cup away from us," said Josh Salmon, the Aggies' PGA Golf Management Program Specialist, who was on hand for last year's victory, which channeled the incredible emotions associated with the unexpected passing of 18 year-old Gage Gavin, the son of New Mexico State's Golf Management Director, Pat Gavin. "Yes, last year was special because of what Pat's family was going through, and those events are always in our minds. That said, we also have 1,300-plus alumni, family and friends of the program that we represent and this victory is for them, too."

The PGA Jones Cup is named for the first PGA Golf Management University Program Director at Mississippi State, Dr. S. Roland Jones, who held the position from 1985 until his passing in 1997. The event provides a platform where participants can display professionalism, integrity, character and camaraderie: all characteristics Dr. Jones instilled in PGA Golf Management students.



#### Men's Women's Golf Team Unveil New Practice Clubhouse

In 2016, the Mississippi State University men's and women's golf teams unveiled their new practice facility, located on the property of the new Mossy Oak Golf Club. The facility includes a five-green driving range, short-game training areas and a 16,000 square foot putting green formed into the shape of the State of Mississippi.

The facility also features a 6,400-square foot team clubhouse with locker rooms,

lounge, coaches' offices, indoor putting center (with SAM PuttLab training system), exercise room and conference room. The project also features a 2,400-square foot indoor hitting bay, equipped with two Trackman swing and ball flight analysis systems and a club repair room.

The Bulldog Club, the private fundraising arm of the Mississippi State Athletics, partnered with Old Waverly Golf Club on the \$2.2 million project.

# **Bulldogs dominate Rebels,** 55-20 to Reclaim Egg Bowl

**OXFORD, Miss.** - In front of the biggest crowd in Egg Bowl history, Mississippi State ran past rival Ole Miss 55-20 to reclaim the Golden Egg trophy Saturday afternoon at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium.

The Bulldogs (5-7, 3-5 SEC) went three-and-out on their first drive, then ramped up for an offensive explosion the rest of the game, quickly taking a 27-10 lead over the Rebels (5-7, 2-6) in the second quarter, before UM trimmed the margin to 27-20 at halftime. But State dominated the second half, outscoring the Rebels 28-0 to cruise to victory in the 113th all-time meeting between the teams. The Bulldogs' 55 points were the most scored in the annual rivalry since MSu score 65 in 1915.

MSU's offensive output came largely on the ground as the sophomore duo of quarterback Nick Fitzgerald and Aeris Williams helped MSU set a new school record for rushing yards in an



SEC game (457). Fitzgerald set MSU's all-time rushing record by a player at any position with 14 carries for 258 yards and two touchdowns.

Mississippi State then capped off the 2016 season with a win in the St. Petersburg Bowl and against the Miami Redhawks, 17-16. It was not pretty, but the win was Coach Mullen's fifth bowl win in his tenure at Mississippi State.

The offseason has been an active one as well, as the Bulldgos hired a new defensive coordinator, Todd Grantham. Grantham came over from the Loiuisville Cardinals. Ironically, Peter Sirmon assumed Grantahm's role as DC at Lousiville.

# John Cohen named University's 17th Athletic Director

Cohen will take over an athletic department that has recently achieved new heights in athletic, academic, facility and fundraising accomplishments. As athletic director, Cohen is charged with providing leadership, management and administration for the university's athletic programs.
